



Mr. Frank Louis Rahmer

Frank Rahmer, a native of San Francisco, passed away in Louisville, Kentucky while enjoying a trip with his brothers from the Asiya Shriners of San Mateo; he was 79. 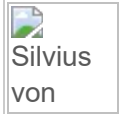
